Reading with your child every day helps to develop pre-reading skills that are a key to success in school and foster a lifelong love of reading. This new, ongoing literacy program is open to any child from birth to five-years-old who has not started kindergarten.

#### **How it Works:**

- Sign up at the Children's Services Desk and pick up a starter packet. This self-paced program runs continuously.
- Color in or check off one circle on your log for each book you read together. If you read a book more than once, you can record it every time. You can also include books read at storytime, books read to your child by others, recorded books, and books read on e-devices.
- Each time you read 100 books, come back to the Library! Your child will get a prize, get to put their name on our Proud Paws Window and get their picture taken.


#### **Tonies**



## Weather and Storm Chasing 101 November 4th, 6:30pm

"Weather and storm chasing" refers to the practice of actively seeking out severe weather events, like tornadoes, large hailstorms, or strong thunderstorms, by following weather forecasts and driving to areas where these storms are likely to occur, often with the goal of observing, documenting, and studying the phenomenon up close, usually done by meteorologists or enthusiasts with specialized weather knowledge and safety protocols in place. Join us as the Storm Science Team tell us stories about the eye of the storm.




#### **Puzzle Swap**
